Some of you by now have received a "CHIC" certificate in the mail from the OFA and are probably wondering just what this certificate is. CHIC is a relatively new health registry data base compiled and maintained by OFA and supported by the AKC Canine Health Foundation efforts. Each parent club that chooses to participate in the program sets up the criteria for their subset database. Our BCOA database was just recently established and set up with the following criteria:

Required criteria:

- Heart certifications performed by a certified cardiologist
- Thyroid certifications performed by OFA acknowledged laboratories
- CERF certificates performed by a certified ophthalmologist

Optional criteria:

- Hip certificate through PENN HIP, OFA, OVC or GDC
- Elbow certificate through OFA

We can choose to change criteria over time based on increase or decrease in any specific health concern for our breed. It is intended to be a tool to help keep us apprised of the health status of our breed over time and also as a means to focus on improving the health in the areas of most concern to our breed. You can access our borzoi database registry at: www.caninehealthinfo.org/borzoi.html

The health committee is looking at ways to utilize the CHIC database registry program in establishing a reward and recognition program for those breeders who actively test and submit data for certification. The registry will accept information for both normal and abnormal results allowing us to accumulate information that will provide a good profile of our breed's health in these areas of concern. Membership input on opportunities for how our club might additionally utilizing this CHIC registry is welcomed! Please feel free to contact me at the

A proposal was made to the board to incorporate heart certification requirements for our Futurity program for both stud dogs and brood bitches at the time the bitch is nominated. Since the Futurity is our National Club's showcase of the very best our breeders have to offer our future generations, it only makes sound sense that we begin implementing health requirements for our club's recognition of breeders. This small step is the right direction we need to go in order to substantiate the sincerity of our interest for Heart Research with the CHF. We must be willing to implement steps currently available to us before breeding, in order to make full use of results provided by a Research Grant Study. If we are not willing to test our breeding stock, then what data will a research specialist utilize? If we aren't willing to use the tools available to us now, then what benefits will we reap from the results of this research study? This proposal to amend the Futurity requirements will be offered up to the club general membership for their vote. I encourage all of you to vote in favor of this proposal and take the first active step towards implementing a program that values the health of our breeding stock every bit as much as it values the conformation.

Time to plan ahead for the upcoming Centennial show in Cincinnati and make sure to set aside some time for health clinics. We plan to offer a full array of clinics including micro chip, heart, eye and thyroid, however, with a schedule as crammed full of activities as this, most likely we will only be able to offer clinics on one or two days. This year forms will be provided on our health information web site so you can print them and fill them out in advance which should help speed up the entire process and limit the waiting time. We will also

include the required forms in the Premium list.

The Canine Health Foundation will be holding their Parent Club Conference the weekend of September 19th in St. Louis to share what's new in health research and disease treatment and prevention with associated breed parent club health representatives. The CHF has also agreed to provide us with a seminar for our Centennial show to cover a great deal of this information as well as their CHIC program and other OFA/AKC CHF activities. I'm looking forward to the conference and the wealth of information to be provided.

Next steps: Over the course of this year, the committee will be working in conjunction with our recommended Heart Research specialist (TBD) to enhance our last breed survey form with more specific questions regarding heart health and incidences of heart disease. Special thanks go to Judy Carleton for providing me with the prior breed survey form from which to start. We want to be sure we compile enough specific detail regarding heart health within the breed over the course of the last 10 years so that we can narrow our heart research to one or two applicable specific areas. Your participation in the survey will be critical to the future success of our Heart research project. We will utilize an on line web based survey as well as hard copy forms. You should anticipate the survey to begin no later than the first of the year with a data accumulation period of 6 months to 1 year. At the end of this period, the data will be statistically accumulated by an independent tabulator and submitted with our application for research grant proposal. We would like to continue to provide the on line survey submission form as a running accumulation of data for a period of time after our survey results submission. The length of this time period is yet to be determined.
